A reminder and request to all members that utilize the range. Our range property and target stands are maintained by volunteers, please consider that when you are there. Use good judgment when placing targets. If you want to shoot at the left over clays, PLEASE place them on the dirt berm behind the 100 yard line. NEVER on or leaning on the railroad ties or steps. The photo above shows the total lack of thought. I don't know why someone would be so dumb as to purposely

destroy the steps. It takes a lot of effort to replace them and the railroad ties behind them. If you have never been to a work day when the ties and steps were replaced, you should. Then you would know how much work it takes, so please **don't shoot at them!** The person that put the clays on the steps should be the one to dig the steps out and replace them all by them self. **Use your head next time, and don't do anything this stupid again!!!**

Steel Plate Duel - June 29, 2019



Saturday June 9th at Chatuge Gun Club was the first Steel Plate Pistol Duel. What we did was line up two separate racks of 10 steel targets on their respective rails. Two shooters would line up and at the signal would begin shooting their bank of targets. The first shooter to complete their bank was declared the winner and would keep on competing until everyone had been eliminated twice. We did not distinguish between iron sights and open sights and or revolvers and in fact a revolver won the rimfire

class outright. After the rimfire match was completed we set up for centerfire with some larger targets at a 20-25 yard distance.

Lever Action Silhouette


July 13, 2019

Smallbore Silhouette

July 27, 2019



10 Shooters came out to challenge each other and the dreadful metal animals. The weather was nice with a slight breeze from time to time in the morning, hotter in the afternoon. Carol always runs a nice match and this one was no different. There were 2 relays of shooters. Each person shoots at each of the 4 different groups of animal silhouette targets. If a person starts shooting at the chickens located at 40 meters, the routine is to fire 5 rounds at the bottom row of 5 targets, after a short time out then the command is given to fire at the second group of 5 targets on the top rail. After all 10 shots have been fired and the firing line has been cleared to be safe with all rifles safe and placed in the rack, then the shooters go down range and reset the targets they hit. Then the person that just shot chickens moves to the pig targets and the other people move to their next group of targets. This procedure continues until all shooters have fought their battle with all 4 groups of animals. Between the Standard Rifle match and the Hunting Rifle match, we have lunch. All shooters bring their own as there are no facilities at the range. At lunch we had a nice treat supplied by Ruby, ice cold watermelon, really hit the spot, thanks Ruby.
